Pulled From the Deep End 6/25/2024

The story is told of a mother and child enjoying a day at the public swimming pool. The lifeguard overheard the child (age 6) telling his mother, "I'm going to swim." The mother replied, "You don't know how to swim yet. You've only had one lesson." The boy insisted he did know how to swim, and set about arguing the point. Mom, realizing she was getting nowhere using rational dialogue said, "Okay, give it a try." The boy, full of confidence, believing he had bested his mother, jumped into the deep end. He flailed his arms and quickly started to sink. When he was about a foot under the water, mom reached down and pulled him out. The boy sputtered, gasped for breath and wiped water off his face. Mom said, "Do you see? You can't swim." To which the boy demanded, "Yes, I can. I can swim." So, mom let him try it again, with the same results. This happened several more times. Finally on the sixth attempt, after the boy sank like a rock, the boy looked at his mother and said, "I guess I can't swim." To which the mom added, "Yet... You can't swim yet. We'll keep taking lessons and it'll happen."

Is that story reminiscent of our attempts to live a Godly life? We have seen other Christians doing well and we think we can do that too.
